Textbook 1: Flamingo

8. Going Places

desires and aspirations.

Poetry:

1. My Mother at Sixty-Six

A reflective poem on the fleeting nature of life and the inevitable separation between a daughter and her aging mother.

2. Keeping Quiet

Advocates for introspection and silence as a means to promote peace and unity in the world.

3. A Thing of Beauty

Celebrates the eternal beauty of nature and its ability to uplift the human spirit, taken from John Keats' Endymion.

4. A Roadside Stand

A poem that highlights the plight of rural people who yearn for urban development, yet remain neglected and marginalized.

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5. Aunt Jennifer's Tigers

A symbolic poem about a woman's struggle for freedom and expression in a patriarchal society.

Textbook 2: Vistas

Vistas offers supplementary readings that challenge students to think critically about various social, moral, and philosophical issues.

1. The Third Level

2. The Tiger King
